

Whipsiderry Beach



- Description: Whipsiderry Beach is a large sandy beach near Newquay. The beach is usually quiet due to difficult access
- Safety: Signs warn of strong under currents and rock falls
- Access: There are very steep steps down the cliff to the beach at Whipsiderry
- Dogs: Dogs allowed all year
- Directions: Whipsiderry Beach is close to Newquay. On the A30 near Indian Queens turn onto the A39 at the Highgate Hill roundabout. Proceed on the A39 north until the next roundabout then take the 2nd left (signposted to Newquay) onto the A392. Follow the A392 to Quintrell Downs. At the roundabout in Quintrell Downs, turn right onto the A3058 and follow this road to the west of Newquay. On the A3058 at the double roundabout turn right onto the B3276 (signposted to Porth). Follow this road down to Porth and park at Porth. Then walk up from Porth to the cliffs at Whipsiderry, taking about 5 minutes
- Parking: No car parking by Whipsiderry Beach. Park at Porth
- Toilets: No. There are toilets at Porth
- Facilities: None
